In Hebrews 12:14 and other passages, we are encouraged to 'strive for peace with everyone'. Who does that include for you that you need some of God's wisdom and power to attempt?

Of the three general truths Bob shared about 'pursuing peace', which of the three would you like to reflect on more and see more progress in?

- Utilize the power of gentleness

Read Proverbs 15:1. Related to the last of the three, when have you seen this actually work?

Digging Deeper:

In the Old Testament, Daniel and his three buddies are great examples of how to maintain convictions and still pursue peace with others.

In the first chapter of Daniel, Daniel had to figure out how to live at peace in the midst of a Babylonian culture that was not only vastly different than his own, but hostile to his faith. King Nebuchadnezzar's plan was to assimilate Daniel and his friends into the Babylonian culture, customs and religion.

Read Daniel 1 and reflect on what you notice about how Daniel and his friends responded to the pressure to conform and still strived toward maintaining peace with those around them. In Daniel 3, three of Daniel's friends were faced with the kind of situation that could easily have caused them to lose their inner peace and doubt God's care for them.

They were told to either worship an idol or be thrown into a blazing furnace.

What can we learn about maintaining peace from their experience in Daniel 3:8-30?

What would you say to someone who wanted to experience the same kind of peace as these three guys?

Wrapping Up:

Looking back on the message from Sunday and from our discussion, what is one truth that stands out to you that you can prayerfully ask God to help apply to your life somehow?
