# GPC's "Living Rooted in Babylon" Small Group Discussion of Daniel 3:1-30 Week 4 of our Study and Discussion of Daniel 1-6

**Check - in....** Choose one of the following questions or provide your own:

How is tomorrow going to be different than today?

You are picked as one of the first 100,000 to colonize Mars. Would you go? Why or why not?

**Pause and Pray:** Be still and know that He is God...God who is present with you, loving you. Surrender yourself to His love. Let's open our hearts, lives and minds to whatever it is He wants to do with us. (pause)... Pray with one another.

# Look back on your message outline or look back over Daniel 3:1-30

What has continued to resonate with you from Sunday's message? Why?

Digging Deeper: What a story! Let's unpack it a bit and see how God leads us:

#### I. Pressure

Ever since the Tower of Babel, people have sinned against God by living independently from Him & working hard to make a name for themselves. We see this with Nebuchadnezzar so clearly.

How do you see this in our world currently?

Do you fold to this pressure or resist this pressure? How?

We discussed last week that when we fear God (hold HIM in the highest regard and highest position in our lives) we need not fear anything else. How do you see this play out in Daniel 3? Nebuchadnezzar said "Bow or burn". The world says if you don't bow (go along with) the world values, you will be burned (ripped off or live a less fulfilled life).

What does the world say life can be found pursuing? What is most tempting for you to consider?

#### II. Principles

Who determines the principles you live by?

When God reveals Himself and His principles of life, do you respond dependently, hesitantly or defiantly?

Conviction: the state of being convinced. After hearing from the serpent, Eve was convinced to take fruit from the tree, eat it and share with her husband. Noah, living in a completely corrupt culture was convinced to walk closely with God for 600 years and build an ark before there had been one drop of rain on the earth. After hearing from Nebuchadnezzar, the three men were convinced to stand for God at their own peril.

Take a moment. What would you identify your top three convictions to be?

Putting yourself in the story, standing before a golden stature. Would what you are convinced of cause you to remain standing? How does even thinking about all of this make you feel? Why? Pastor Bob shared it is important to be prepared, to know your convictions ahead of time and avoid deciding on principles to live by in the heat of moment. Don't expect others to applaud, be prepared to stand alone. Are there any convictions that you sense God is inviting you to consider, reconsider or commit to stand in today? Ask the group for prayer if needed.

#### III. Power

What defines me? What controls me? What frustrates me? Who is bigger to me, not just in thought but in action - God, people, world, myself? These are all questions that help us know what has power over us. How did Nebuchadnezzar answer these? The three young men? You?

# **IV. Promises**

If we are God's children, we can always rely on the promises of God; we can always rest assured in Him, His love, His presence, His principles, His power. As you read the following grace-filled promises of God, which one resonates with you the most right now? Why? Do these help you identify and solidify your convictions?

"To all who mourn in Israel, he will give a crown of beauty for ashes, a joyous blessing instead of mourning, festive praise instead of despair. In their righteousness, they will be like great oaks that the Lord has planted for his own glory." Isaiah 61:3
