IMMANUEL AGENDA: GOD'S HEART TO BE WITH US Waiting on God for the Messiah in the temple - and responding Faithfully

Waiting: to allow time to go by especially while staying in one place until someone comes, or until something that you are expecting happens. A person is prepared to take action but must wait until an action or arrival external to one's control has taken place.

On God: God the Creator, Righteous, Holy, Just, Deliverer, All-Powerful, Almighty, Everlasting, Sacrificially Loving, Gracious God of the Universe and King of Heaven and Earth — God who always has been, who is and who is to come ...

For the Messiah: Promised Deliverer. He came to usher in the Kingdom of God. His coming would change everything!

In the temple: a place for faithful worshipers where God and mankind come together. A Holy and sacred place where God is served, honored and loved above all else.

Faithfully: Responding to God and His promises with sincere and steady allegiance and affection. Loyal and constant adoration to God. SEEKING HIS FACE AND HIS HEART!

Immanuel: GOD WITH US - O Come let us adore Him faithfully

Then: Luke 2:21-38

Now: Immanuel! Christ has Come! Salvation is now! God is with us!

Faithfully Waiting with God Now:

John 14: 18-23

"I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father and I will love him and manifest myself to him. If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him and we will come to him and make our home with him."

We, too, wait with eager hope for the day when God will give us our full rights as his adopted children, including the new bodies he has promised us. 24 We were given this hope when we were saved. (If we already have something, we don't need to hope for it. 25 But if we look forward to something we don't yet have, we must wait patiently and confidently.) 26 And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness."

Acts 1:8

"As he was about to ascend and depart the disciples (and us) ask, "Lord, when will you restore the kingdom??? he said, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be my witnesses ..."
